Dear Dr. Selagamsetty:

Inquiry Panel B of the Colorado State Board of Medical Examiners has concluded its inquiry regarding your treatment of Patient A. The Panel voted to administer disciplinary action to you in the form of this Letter of Admonition.

You treated Patient A from January 30, 2001 through June 30, 2003. Patient A was a medically complicated patient with an extensive medical and psychiatric history, including substance abuse. During the time in which Patient A was under your care, the patient was seen ten times at your office before you discharged the patient for non-compliance with your treatment plan.

You failed to timely recognize and respond to the fact that Patient A was abusing prescription narcotics, thus constituting unprofessional conduct pursuant to § 12-36-117 (1)(p), C.R.S. The Panel acknowledges that this was a medically challenging case, and acknowledges that you have voluntarily attended documentation and prescription courses to address some of the issues raised by Patient A.


By this letter, the Panel hereby admonishes you and cautions you that complaints disclosing any repetition of such practice may lead to the commencement of formal disciplinary proceedings against your license to practice medicine, wherein this Letter of Admonition may be entered into evidence as aggravation.

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You are advised that it is your right to have this case reviewed by judicial procedure. To do so, you must submit a written request within twenty (20) days after receipt of this letter. In your request, you must clearly ask that formal disciplinary proceedings be initiated against you to adjudicate the propriety of the conduct upon which this letter of admonition is based. If such request is timely made, this letter of admonition will be deemed vacated, and the matter will be processed by means of a formal complaint and hearing. This is in accordance with the provisions of the Medical Practice Act governing the discipline of licensed physicians.
